Bamboo Thatched House Workshop:

On 15 and 16 April 2017 we conducted a Bamboo Thatched House Workshop at Auroville Bamboo Centre. There were 19 students from France who attended the workshop and another 4 students from other countries.



Bamboo Construction Experience (Bamboo Culm Techniques)

From 18 to 24 April 2017 a full Bamboo Culm Techniques Workshop was conducted at Auroville Bamboo Centre from 9am till 5pm on each of the five days. The students who participated were from different parts of the state in India.

In the first workshop there were four students who participated; in the second workshop there were nineteen students who participated.

Feedback from the participants was a mixture of positive and negative.

Positive: The workshop was well prepared in terms of sequence and structure of activities, material and tools as well.

The people involved liked the teacher and all those who helped during the session.

Bamboo Construction Experience (Split Bamboo Techniques)

During April to June we have conducted two Split bamboo Techniques Workshops – one from 24 to 27 May 2017 and another from 15 to 17 June 2017 – at Auroville Bamboo Centre. The students who participated were from different parts of the state in India as well as from abroad. The workshop was conducted for 5 days from 9am to 5pm.

During this workshop the students has developed two structures with split bamboo techniques.



Earth & Bamboo Workshop

From 8 to 12 May 2017 we offered a 5-day together with the Auroville Earth Institute (AVEI) and Auroville Green Practices (AGP). Nineteen students from various places in India and abroad participated and learned about bamboo construction and earth building development.

1st week in bamboo centre was dedicated to observation. In that I have learned different types of Joineries, supporting structure systems in bamboo and physical properties of bamboo.

From 2nd week onwards I was given task, starting from soap packaging box (Finishing part of it), than creating a lamp (mix media i.e. mixing other material with bamboo) also made a pen stand and towel hanger from the bamboo. Continued the same project in 3rd week.
