On October 10th to 16th we offered a four day Bamboo furniture and Jewellery workshop for ten students from **Mahendra United College**. The students developed some furniture and designed innovative Jewellery, and also had an Auroville and Pondicherry experience.



On October 12th to 16th we offered a five day **Earth & Bamboo workshop** together with the Auroville Earth Institute (AVEI) and Auroville Green Practices (AGP). Twenty-three students from various places in India and abroad participated and learned about bamboo construction and earth building development.

Flooded at Bamboo Land:

The monsoon hit Tamil Nadu and Pondicherry very hard this year. The Bamboo Forest is located along a pond which was not filled up for 30 years the way it is now. The water is standing for over a month also on our land, not draining off till end of next month which means that nearly all of our plants are covered with water for a long time that most of them will not survive. The roots will rot, only few plants are having leafs above water level which means they are not getting any sun or air.

With all this damage a lot of repairs are needed. We need new plants and have to set up a new, bigger nursery to start growing new plants and try to rescue whatever we can.





Bamboo Fest Exhibition 2015 at Kerala:

From December 4th to 8th, the twelfth Kerala Bamboo Fest took place in Kochi, Kerala. The fair had doors open all day from Friday till Tuesday. It is organized by the Department of Industries, in association with the Kerala State Bamboo Mission and the Kerala Bureau of Industrial Promotion, with the aim of promoting bamboo products. The Auroville Bamboo Centre participated in this yearly event, continuing our success story from 2014.



Walter, volunteering and living at the Bamboo Centre since three years, and Felix, a one-year German Weltwärts volunteer, left Auroville on a bus bound for Kochi with four suitcases full of products made at the Auroville Bamboo Centre, Lively and Mohanam. Inside the suitcases were bamboo charcoal and bamboo leaf soaps, bamboo lamps, toys, pens, scarves, vases, flutes, rain sticks and much more.

Arriving Friday morning, it was time to build up the stall in the air conditioned tent. About 120 different units and organizations exhibited their products or work. Very soon the first visitors came and so some first sales were had.

Also, some first contacts with other exhibitors and visitors looking for a collaboration or partnership were made.

Saturday and Sunday were very busy, as a lot of visitors came and looked around the stalls. With the special products and some presentation of the flutes and the dragon fly, the ABC stand attracted a lot of people. With non-stop high sales (and even more explanations about the Bamboo Centre and Auroville) a lot of products sold out and the remaining stock was rearranged to concentrate on selling leftovers.

Monday and Tuesday were calmer, with school and college groups exchanging families and day tourists. Also, different newspapers and TV channels passed by, all of them interested in our work and Auroville. Some visitors knew about Auroville or already visited our place and were really happy to see us over there on the west coast. On Tuesday afternoon we packed one suitcase of remaining products and took the bus back home to Auroville.

We got a lot of nice feedback at the Bamboo Fest from visitors and other exhibitors, telling us that our products are having a "modern design" and "very good finish". In comparison to others, we had unique products to sell which attracted people and we started making contacts with retailers and business people. It was a very nice experience and good to see what other units are producing all over India out of bamboo. See you next year at the Bamboo Fest!



Ayutha Pooja Celebration:

On October 21st, we celebrated Ayutha pooja. The principal Shakti goddesses worshiped during the Ayutha puja are Saraswati (the Goddess of wisdom, arts and literature), Lakshmi (the goddess of wealth) and Parvati (the divine mother).



Apart from various types of equipment; it is on this occasion that weapons are worshipped by soldiers and tools are revered by artisans. The Pooja is considered a meaningful custom, with its focus of specific attention on one's profession and its related tools and it connotes that a divine force is working behind it to perform well and for getting the proper reward.
